Member Profile of the Month

Frank Goodrum bought his first Gremlin back in 1972 as a family car. At that time, he never realized how significant this car would be to him. He proudly drove his family down to visit his dad in Lafayette, LA in his new 1972 butterscotch Gremlin with white stripes down the hood. The first thing his dad said was, "son, that's the ugliest car I have ever seen in my life". Well, his dad checked the "ugly" car out and saw that it had a 304V8 engine with a three speed stick shift with a heck of a kick to it. Dad drove it once and continued to drive the "ugly" Gremlin around town the entire time that Frank and his family were visiting. Frank's dad never admitted how much he liked his son's car, but the smile on his face was more than enough to know that he was in heaven when he was driving it.

Years went by and the Gremlin was replaced with other family cars and Frank's dad passed away as well, but in 2005 Frank found an old 1975 beat up Gremlin that was totally torn up. There wasn't anything really appealing about the car, but Frank remembered how his dad loved his 1972 Gremlin years ago, and how he enjoyed driving that car around town. It was a memorable time for both Frank and his dad, so Frank decided to take the challenge on for old times' sake. **In** honor of his dad, he bought the old beat up piece of rusty tin for restoration. Frank totally gutted the car and replaced the entire interior, including new seats, all of the chrome, door panels, brakes, shocks and exhaust system. The engine and transmission were full of water when Frank bought the car, so he had to replace these as well. He added a tachometer and totally revised the instrumentation panel on the car. The shoulder harness seat belts were missing from the car so Frank inserted two Louisiana quarters in the empty holes where the seatbelt anchors should have been in the inside roof of the car. (Dad, this one's for you!!) It took Frank 4 years (and a mere 20K) to rebuild this car, with the blood, sweat and tears of many friends as well. He ordered parts from Ohio, Illinois, Michigan and as far as Texas, to rebuild this Gremlin. According to Frank, this was a "rebuild of frustration and passion".

Most people turn their head and take a second look when Frank passes them by on the road. The youngsters have no idea what kind of car this is, and the oldsters all smile and give Frank a "thumbs up". Some people even stop at his home to look at the Gremlin when they are driving by, just because this car is so rare to see these days. The Gremlin was produced only between 1971 through 1976. Frank chose to paint his remodeled Gremlin a bright reddish-orange with white stripes down the hood. Over the years Frank has invested \$20,000.00 in rebuilding this commemorative vehicle. When Frank talks about his car, he smiles with pride, but what he really is thinking about is how his dad would have loved to have driven this "ugly car" once again. Authored by Frank Goodrum
