

Cruising in a 1966 Charger

You might think that being born and raised in Detroit would automatically make you a car nut from birth ... or at least catch the bug at a very young age.

Ken Scobel always liked cars, but when his father, Wallace, took him to the Ford Rotunda as a child in 1958 he really started to appreciate how cool all the new cars were. It was just before Christmas and the rotunda was decorated for the holidays. There was music playing, and, of course, Santa was there to entertain the kids; the new Fords were on display to entertain the dads.

The rotunda, a huge circular building in Dearborn, was open year-round to showcase all of Ford's new models, and there were knowledgeable reps on hand to answer questions and give test rides on the outside track. This differed from a dealership in that there was no sales pressure; the huge exhibit was popular as most new car dealers in the area lacked showroom space and could only display a few models indoors and out of the harsh Michigan winters.

Soon after that, a young teenaged Ken would ride his bicycle to the rotunda and catch rides in the cars as they were driven on the test track by either Ford reps or prospective customers.

Ken soon learned where various dealers would hide the new models before their introduction each September and would make the rounds on his bike to see them. He really liked the 1963 Corvette, which had the one-year-only split rear-window design.

Then in the summer of 1963 his dad took him to the drag races for the first time. It was there that he saw factory-backed teams such Golden Commando's, which championed new Plymouths on the strip, and the Ramcharger team that ran new Dodges. It was then that 16-year-old Ken became a Mopar man!

In the summer of 1965, Ken graduated from St. Mary's of Redford High School in Detroit and decided to join the U.S. Air Force. He wouldn't leave until January of the next year, so he bought his first car, a 1956 Ford twodoor sedan, for \$100. The car would get him by until he left for the service.

He spent the majority of his time stationed at an air base in Pakistan, where he was able to keep up on Detroit's latest offerings on the Internet – oops, I mean car magazines!

A month before Ken got out of the Air Force in March 1968, he had his parents order a new Plymouth Roadrunner for him. When he returned home he went to Chalfonte Sales and Service, the local Plymouth dealer, to pick up his car. The Roadrunner was dark green and equipped with a 383 big block and a four-speed transmission. He drove the car for a little more than 18 months before trading it for a new 1970 Dodge Challenger with a 440 six-pack.

In the spring of 1970, Ken and the Challenger hit the drag strip. The car was thrashed down the strip every weekend at Milan Raceway, west of Detroit. By 1973 the 440 engine was getting tired and using a lot of oil. Ken pulled the old 440 out and borrowed a 383 V-8 from a friend to install in the Challenger so he could use it for a daily driver. He then came across a 1966 Plymouth Satellite two-door hardtop with a 426 Hemi.

He wanted to rebuild the Hemi and put it in the '70 Challenger so he could put it back on the drag strip. First, however, he rebuilt the 440 that came in the Challenger and put it in the '66 Satellite so he would have a daily driver.

After driving the Satellite only six months, he went outside one morning in January 1974 to find that it had been stolen, never to be seen again. He then decided to give up hot-rodding for awhile; he sold the 426 Hemi, returned the 383 to his friend and sold the engineless 1970 Challenger. He used the money for a down payment on a 1974 Dodge Colt four-cylinder. OUCH!

It would be nearly 30 years before Ken ventured back into muscle cars. Then in 2003, he was cruising the Internet and found a 1966 Dodge Charger on eBay. It belonged to a classic car dealer in Phoenix. Ken showed the car to his wife of 36 years, **Sharon**, who liked the light yellow color and suggested he bid on it.



Ken won the bid and had it shipped to his home in Columbus, Ind. He did a little work on the 383 and some other minor things and has been driving it to shows with his friends in the Indy Mopar Club ever since.

The old Charger was originally from Texas and has working factory air conditioning, allowing Ken to take the car out of state to shows in total comfort. The Challenger has been to the CEMA show at the Chrysler Museum in Auburn Hills, Mich., several times and to Columbus, Ohio, for the Mopar Nationals. 1966 was the first year for the Charger, and there are not a lot of them left. But Ken has one of the nicest examples around so he can keep on cruising.
